The Liturgy for Holy Baptism

P. We gather in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C. Amen

The Entrance Hymn: #445 WASH O GOD, OUR SONS AND DAUGHTERS (stanza 1)

1. Wash, O God, our sons and daughters, where your cleansing waters flow. Number them among your people; bless as Christ blessed long ago. Weave them garments bright and sparkling; compass them with love and light. Fill, anoint them; send your Spirit, holy dove and heart's delight.

The Presentation

- P. God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and sent out in mission for the life of the world.
- P. Trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your child baptized? **Parents: I do.**
- P. Sierra, do you promise to nurture Mateo Christopher in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church? **Sponsor. I do**
- P. As you bring Mateo Christopher to receive the gift of baptism, you are entrusted with responsibilities: to live with him among God's faithful people, to bring him to the word of God and the holy supper, teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commandments, place in his hands the holy scriptures, and nurture him in faith and prayer, so that he may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace. Do you promise to help him grow in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Sponsor: I do.

Congregation

P. People of God, do you promise to support Mateo Christopher and pray for him in his new life in Christ?

C. We do.

RENUNCIATION OF EVIL (entire congregation)

- P. Through baptism we are called out of darkness into God's marvelous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.
- P. Therefore I ask you: Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?
- C. I reject them.
- P. Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? C. I renounce them.
- P. Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbor?
- C. I repent of them.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

- P. Do you believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth?
- C. I believe.
- P. Do you believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the Virgin Mary, who suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; who descended to the dead, and on the third day rose again; who ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, who will come to judge the living and the dead?
- C. I believe.
- P. Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting?
- C. I believe.

THE THANKSGIVING

- P. The Lord be with you. C. And also with you.
- P. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
- C. It is right to give our thanks and praise.
- P. We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

- C. We welcome you into the body of Christ and the mission we share. Join us as we give praise to God and bear God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.



The First Lesson: Isaiah 35:1-10

¹The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus ²it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the LORD, the majesty of our God. ³Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. ⁴Say to those who are of a fearful heart, "Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you." ⁵Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; ⁶then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy. The Nicene Creed
