Pastor's Letter

August Stewardship: Konde Diocese - Our Partner in Ministry

You may or may not know that each of the sixty-five synods of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has been linked with a Lutheran companion synod or church body outside the United States with which to partner in ministry and provide each other support through prayer and opportunities to engage with each other. We in the Lower Susquehanna Synod have been blessed with the companionship of the Konde Diocese, which is part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania (ELCT). The Konde Diocese at present boasts a membership of over 125,000 members in seven church districts. Within these seven districts there are more than 100 congregations that are served by 160 pastors and 200 evangelists, who are serving God's people and spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ, which they have been faithfully doing since 1977.

The operative word in beginning to understand the nature of this ministry partnership and its benefits is "companion." Each of our synods/diocese and the congregations that make up these bodies are called to serve our neighbor and share the life-giving gospel of Jesus Christ. Doing so, no matter if one is part of a congregation in Ephrata, Pennsylvania or a congregation in a town in the Konde Diocese, has its challenges as well as its joys. And the work we have been called to do becomes easier, and I believe more meaningful, when we know there is a group of folks supporting us and the ongoing work we are doing as we in turn offer our mutual support for them and their ongoing ministry. Such a relationship also provides the opportunity to learn from each other as we learn about each other through correspondence and the sharing of ideas. This is especially relevant as we in this nation struggle with shrinking congregations and a waning interest in organized religion while Christian churches in Africa and other less developed parts of the world are experiencing a boom in persons embracing the gospel and its grace-filled message.

During the month of August the Konde Diocese will be our stewardship focus, and we will be prayerfully focusing on how we as a congregation can be actively engaged in a relationship with the diocese and its individual congregations—supporting their ministries as we support

theirs. To help us learn more about this special relationship and how we can best be engaged in this important work, Pastor Clifton Eshbach, who serves on the synod committee directly engaged with the diocese, will be joining us in worship on **Sunday, August 14** to share what is happening in the diocese and with the synod's relationship with them, as well as providing us with ideas of how we can begin our own relationship with them as a companion in ministry. That morning, Pastor Eshbach will be providing us with a temple talk and an in-depth program following worship. Pastor Eshbach comes to us with a wealth of knowledge and personal insights from his numerous visits to Tanzania and the congregations of the Konde Diocese. I encourage everyone to make time in their morning to be present at both learning opportunities.

Dear Friends.

You may have seen the distressing news about flash flooding in eastern Kentucky. A line of severe storms dumped record amounts of rain on the area, overflowing rivers and creeks onto streets and neighborhoods. The floodwaters rose in the middle of the night from July 27 to 28, leaving people little time to evacuate. I'm writing to you today because, to respond, we need your help.

These severe floods are not limited to Kentucky. There has also been flooding in Missouri, Illinois, Indiana, West Virginia and other states in the region.

At the time of writing this note, the death toll in Kentucky was at 16 people, and more deaths are expected as search and rescue efforts continue. Though hundreds of people have been rescued, the number of people missing is still unknown. Rising waters have damaged infrastructure, including roads, bridges and power lines, which hinders rescue efforts. The flooding has damaged hundreds of homes and other buildings and disrupted the lives of families.

The survivors of the flooding need your support. Your gifts to "U.S. Flooding" will be used in full (100%) to assist those affected by the record-setting rainfall.

As the waters recede and the full scope of the damage is assessed, Lutheran Disaster Response will work with the Indiana-Kentucky Synod and local community partners to focus on long-term needs. There are several ELCA churches in the impacted area, and we continue to be in communication with them. We anticipate our response to include rebuilding homes, replacing lost household items and providing emotional and spiritual care to survivors. We will also continue to accompany survivors of the December 2021 tornadoes in western Kentucky.

We pray that God's presence will be felt amid suffering and bring comfort to those who are hurting. Together, we can show our neighbors in Kentucky that they are not alone. Thank you for your partnership.
