Included in the bundle is a goat, rooster, cow, three chicks, seeds and gardening tools, honeybees, three fruit-tree seedlings. farmer's field school and community garden- gifts that will enable neighbors to nourish themselves and their families and generate income. The seeds of hope you help you neighbors plant today will continue to grow for generations to come.



ELEVATOR RESTORATION PROJECT

The Stewardship Committee at the November meeting after a long and informative discussion about the manner in which our congregation may support the Elevator Restoration Project, suggested that a monthly financial commitment be promoted. The monthly donation from the congregation should be at least \$1,800.00. This amount is well within the ability of the congregation to meet or exceed. Many options concerning each individual donation can be determined. The committee feels that each member has the ability to determine the amount that they will, through prayer commit to

this project. We feel that the generous spirit of our congregation will assure a more realistic period of time to reach our goal of \$200,000.00. The Stewardship Committee will continue to monitor the financial support of this project and keep the congregation informed as to our current status. There is a visual display in the gathering area of the nave which indicates the current totals of the donations.



Christmas Food Baskets

Due to the outpouring of community donations for Thanksgiving food and meals and the SNAP crisis, the Social Ministry Committee will be collecting food items to make Christmas Food Baskets. We were given the names of 20 area families in need from Ephrata Area Social Services. We need your help! Using your donations, we will provide these families with a Christmas Dinner. Please bring in food items according to your last name.

E-H: canned peas or corn I-L: canned sweet potatoes M-P: seasoned stuffing

Q-S: instant potatoes or scallop potatoes

T-Z: jello snack packs (premade jello in containers) or package cookies or applesauce

We are also accepting donations of frozen 10-14 lb turkeys and 5 to 8 lb chicken roasters. Contact the church office or Rob Gilbert if you can donate a turkey or chicken no later than December 7th. Monetary donations to purchase items will be greatly appreciated. Donations can be dropped off at the church and placed in the box in the Gathering Area.

Note the Neighborhood Santa Program we have participated in the last several years will not be held this year. In place of that we ask you to bring in extra food items or you can purchase a gift for the family (e.g. gift card or other family type gift).

Donations: Currently there is a need for men's pants, shorts and shoes. There is always a need for children's clothing. All clothing in good shape is accepted. Due to space constraints, household items are no longer accepted. Donations may be dropped off directly at Bergstrasse when the Community Clothing Closet is open or in the box at the back of the narthex in Holy Trinity.

Volunteers: sort clothing, hang it and tag it by color to keep track of what is moving and what is not, and greet shoppers at the courtesy desk. Shoppers check in and specify how many people they are shopping for and what items are of particular interest. Volunteers are needed from 11:30 – 2:30 on Saturdays and Sundays. You do not need to be there the entire time to volunteer – whatever time you have available within those timeframes is fine.
