October Stewardship Focus: Milagro House

Our Mission: Milagro House provides education, housing and support services for women and their children who would otherwise be experiencing homelessness. Our vision is to prepare the women and children who come through our doors with the skills they need to break the cycle of homelessness and poverty and move from dependence to self-sufficiency. What sets Milagro House apart in our industry is the educational component to the program. Education is the underpinning of everything we do at Milagro House and is the catalyst for women moving from dependence to independence through meaningful employment at a self-sustaining wage.

Services Provided:

Educational Services

Women accepted into our program must be committed to pursuing educational advancement. The staff at Milagro House customizes each woman's program to meet her specific needs and interests. Milagro House offers two educational options for women in our program GED Program: Provides GED classes conducted by a certified teacher and volunteer tutors. Post-Secondary Programs: Works with staff to develop a post-secondary education plan and attend college and certification programs of their choice.

Residential and Support Services

Provides support through – Housing for women and children customized case management, individual and group

counseling, parenting programs, life skills training, children's programs.

LESSONS FROM DIETRICH BONHOEFFER

Beginning Sunday, September 28, the Sunday Adult Forum will be engaging in a multi-week study entitled Lessons from Dietrich Bonhoeffer in a House Divided and a World on Fire. The study was created by Dr. Lori Brandt Hale, a professor at Augsburg University and President of The International Bonhoeffer Society—English Language Section in concert with the Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in Pennsylvania (LAMPa). The overarching theme of the study will be "Who is Christ for us today," a question Dietrich

Bonhoeffer asked himself and others in the midst of the authoritarianism of the Nazi regime under which he and his fellow Germans lived and through which he and they experienced the persecution of their vulnerable neighbors and friends. The curriculum will encourage us to honestly ask that question for ourselves in this particular time and place we find ourselves.

"Who is Christ for us? How are we to best love our neighbors? What is the ethic of love and discipleship that will help us to be most faithful? What are the tools at our disposal to live this out?" If we are faithful to our baptismal calling and Jesus' unwavering command to love our neighbor and our enemy, these are but a handful of the things we need to be considering in the times we find ourselves when violence has been normalized and those in power are seeking to turn us against each other through propaganda, vitriolic language, and the inciting of baseless distrust and fear of the "other."

As Christians we are called to follow Jesus, and Jesus alone, and be hope-filled agents of change and support for all God's beloved children armed not with hearts of hate but rather hearts overflowing with living water and God's ever-present, life-giving love and grace. Please make time in your lives to attend this study and faithfully engage with your fellow siblings in Christ as we seek to perpetuate the relationship healing kingdom of God in our relationships, our community, and beyond.

The weekly Adult Forum starts at 10:20 AM each Sunday morning following worship. We look forward to learning and growing together with you in our faithful pursuit of loving and standing with all our neighbors in these divisive times.

Help Wanted: Bergstrasse Community Clothing Closet

Bergstrasse Community Clothing Closet is open for all people in need of clothing and other household goods. Entrance is accessible via the door off the lower parking lot. Hours are 12 – 2pm.

Donations: Currently there is a continuing need for men's pants, shorts and shoes. There is always a need for children's clothing. All clothing in good shape is accepted. Donations may be dropped off directly at Bergstrasse when the Community Clothing Closet is open or in the box at the back of the narthex in Holy Trinity. Thank you so much for sharing what God has given you! Your generosity is helping those in need in our community!

Please note new donation policy: due to limited space household items can no longer be accepted, only clothing and shoes.

Volunteers: sort clothing, hang it and tag it by color to keep track of what is moving and what is not, and greet shoppers at the courtesy desk. Shoppers check in and specify how many people they are shopping for and what items are of particular interest. Volunteers meet at 6-7:30pm on the Friday before the Closet is open to sort donations and get them ready for the next day. When the Closet is open, volunteers are needed from 11:30 – 2:30 on Saturdays and Sundays. You do not need to be there the entire time to volunteer – whatever time you have available within those times is fine.
